is possible to walk along the parkway, which is not too steep at this point

# Site Description

**Property ownership:** owned and managed by the National Park Service as part of the Blue Ridge Parkway

**Likely spots for species of interest:** this stretch of the Parkway excellent for warblers in spring and summer; may find Wood Thrush, Scarlet Tanagers and several species of vireos and woodpeckers; can walk .3 mile north from the overlook along the Parkway to a large rock escarpment at Milepost 270.5 where Cerulean Warblers have been reported

## **Special Considerations**

Traffic may be issue, especially on weekends; the Parkway also popular with cyclists - and you don't always hear them coming!

**<u>Directions:</u>** from Boone head east on US 421 S 9.5 miles. Take exit onto the Blue Ridge Parkway and travel north for 6.8 miles to the overlook
