<u>Habitats:</u> pond, old-growth rhododendrons, mixed hardwood forest, wooded creek, open pasture, wildflower meadow, hemlocks

Access and Parking: open year-round depending on weather

Parking: well-maintained paved lot with unpaved parking as well, for 20-30 vehicles

**Drinking water:** not available **Restrooms:** not available

Accessibility: the Sims Creek Overlook is accessible, the trail is not

#### **Site Description**

**Property ownership:** owned and managed by the National Park Service as part of the Blue Ridge Parkway

Trails: 2.3 mile loop

**Trail surface and elevation gain:** 615 feet in elevation gain, trail generally moderate with several stream crossings with a few tricky spots that can be strenuous. Strongly recommended to start by crossing the dam at Sims Pond. Beginning in the other direction, a prolonged and steep uphill section makes for a very strenuous hike.

**Likely spots for species of interest:** ducks on Sims Pond in winter and early spring, along with kingfishers and warblers. Creekside sections good for Brown Creepers in winter and warblers during breeding and migration. Pasture good for sparrows and hawks soaring overhead. Wildflower meadow great for sparrows and indigo buntings.

## **Special Considerations**

**Hunting:** not allowed

**Need for boots/waterproof footwear:** several creek crossings, generally with stepping stones or large log, but waterproof shoes recommended

**Other:** again, start by crossing the Sims Pond Dam to avoid very strenuous hike in opposite direction

### **Directions**

**From Boone / Blowing Rock:** travel on the Blue Ridge Parkway SOUTH to Sims Pond Overlook on the left. Blue Ridge Parkway milepost 295.9

**From Points South:** travel on the Blue Ridge Parkway NORTH about one mile past Price Lake to Sims Pond Overlook on right. Blue Ridge Parkway milepost 295.9
